It gives a little, and then it gives more if you do not abuse the first little. It is like floating in water, once you stop fighting it, you float even better. Leave the silence open-ended. Do not try to settle the dust. Do not try to resolve the inner conflict. Do not seek a glib, quick answer, but leave all things for a while in the silent space. Do not rush to judgement This is what it really means that God alone is the judge. Inner silence frees you from the burden of thinking that your judgment is needed or important.
